




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How to get there



Arrival by public transport (bern train station)

- 20 minutes walking distance from Bern train station or
- 6 minutes by PostBus line 101 (Güterbahnhof stop). The building is located 200 meters to the north-east

Arrival by private vehicle

The nearest parking garages are:

- Parking garage Insel (exit Forsthaus, then follow the signs "Inselspital" and "Insel-Parking"). 700m walk to fabrikHALLE
- Parkhaus Neufeld (exit Neufeld, then follow the signs "P+R") 1.5km walk to fabrikHALLE
